REGULAR MEETING  
JULY 12, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Janet Craig, Raymond Chappell, Thomas Gallant, Manager Christopher Caruso, Assistant Manager Thomas Garrett, and Solicitor Alan Shuckrow from Strassburger, McKenna, Gutnick and Gefsky. Recording the minutes was Secretary-Treasurer Cynthia Harris.

\* ANNOUNCEMENT AN EXECUTIVE SESSION WAS HELD PRIOR TO THE MEETING TO DISCUSS PERSONNEL ISSUES

**MOTION TO ADD AGENDA ITEM - *Consideration of Alro Steel Preliminary and Final Land Development applications. Mr. Chappell moved to add the aforementioned agenda items. Seconded by Mr. Gallant. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.***

\* ALRO STEEL PRELIMINARY AND FINAL LAND DEVELOPMENT

Mr. Caruso read from his June 28, 2023 review letters noting Alro Steel is proposing to construct an 85,008 square foot addition (that was approved in 2010) to the existing 91,903 square foot building on a 15-acre parcel on Solar Drive along with 32 truck parking stalls. Mr. Caruso noted they are requesting a modification for eight (8) of the truck stalls to be located in the front along Solar Drive and the Planning Commission did recommend these applications on June 27, 2023.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to approve the Alro Steel Preliminary and Final Land Development applications to construct an 85,008 square foot addition (that was initially approved in 2010) to the existing 91,903 square foot building on a 15-acre parcel on Solar Drive with 32 truck parking stalls to include a modification approved in 2010 noting that eight truck parking stalls will be located in the front along Solar Drive. These applications, with modification, were recommended by the Planning commission on June 27, 2023 and contingent upon approval of the Township Engineer. Seconded by Mr. Gallant. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* RESOLUTION 2023-17 - PLANNING MODULE EXEMPTION FOR MODERN LIVING SOLUTIONS

Mr. Caruso explained Modern Living Solutions has presented a Sewage Facilities Planning Module for the apartments on Spring Run Road Extension and the Findlay Township Municipal Authority has reviewed the Planning Module and is in agreement with it as presented.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to approve Resolution 2023-17 for the MLS-LTD Spring Run Owners LLC Sewage Facilities Planning Module for Spring Run Road Extension. Seconded by Mr. Gallant. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* RESOLUTION 2023-18 - CONTRACT FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

Mr. Caruso presented the resolution to accept the SHACOG Solid Waste Collection contract after the bid package was prepared and solicited by SHACOG. Mr. Caruso explained this is the biggest Waste contract in all of western Pennsylvania and SHACOG received two bidders. The Township then selected the lowest bid to accept. Mr. Gallant questioned why North Fayette has a different hauler. Mr. Caruso explained they are not part of SHACOG and have to pay higher pricing for not being part of a Council of Governments. Mr. Caruso noted the biggest difference between the two bids was that Westmoreland, the other bidder, did not have an automated option and the manual option was more expensive.

Don Nieman, 116 Lenox Drive, questioned who the new hauler would be. The Board indicated Waste Management would continue as the Township hauler. Mr. Caruso noted that the new contract would change recycling collection to weekly; glass will be added back to the curbside recycling; leaf and yard waste will still be collected; At-Your-Door will still be available for Household Hazardous Waste; and bulk items will still be collected. Mr. Caruso noted the biggest change in the contract will be that all waste MUST be enclosed in the trash tote and additional totes can be used, but the resident will pay an extra \$110 per year for each additional tote. Nothing will be accepted outside the tote.

Robert Miller, 118 Lenox Drive, questioned who they should contact if the Waste Management truck leaves hydraulic fluid or glass on the road. Mr. Caruso requested they advise Mr. Garrett of the truck number and location. Mr. Garrett commented that Country Hauling recently had no less than 30 places where they left garbage juice on the roadways in McDonald.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to approve Resolution 2023-18 to enter into a contract for Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Services coordinated and administered by SHACOG for 2024-2028. Seconded by Mr. Gallant. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* RESOLUTION 2023-20 - ACT 13 MONIES ADDED TO BUDGET

Mr. Caruso noted that the Act 13 monies received will be transferred to the Capital Reserve account.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to approve Resolution 2023-20 providing for supplemental appropriations to the 2023 Budget for Act 13 Monies received in the amount of \$176,412.98. Mr. Gallant seconded. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* CONTRACT 2023-2 MAIN STREET RECONSTRUCTION

Mr. Caruso explained bids were received for the reconstruction of Main Street at Route 30. Mr. Caruso noted that a gaming funds grant in the amount of \$125,000 will be used for this project.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to award the bid for the 2023-2 Main Street Reconstruction with Route 30 intersection to A. Folino Construction at their bid price of \$136,989.00 as reviewed and recommended by the Township Engineer. Mr. Gallant seconded. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* CONTRACT 23-SW1 STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS

Mr. Caruso reported Tim Cook worked with Lennon, Smith, Souleret to put these improvements out to bid, noting that they are required MS4 improvements that are done yearly. The recommended low bid was J. Parrish Excavating and all costs will be paid with MS4 Stormwater funds.

Mr. Chappell made a Motion to award the bid for the 23-SW1 Stormwater Improvements at their bid price of \$326,290.00 to J. Parrish Excavating as reviewed and recommended by the Township Engineer. Mr. Gallant seconded. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

\* BILLS AND PAYROLL

Mr. Chappell moved to approve the bills and payroll that have been approved for payment. Mr. Gallant seconded. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. Chappell moved to approve the minutes of the June meeting as printed and available for viewing on the Township's website. Mr. Gallant seconded. 3 Ayes. Motion carried.
